











# FELINE ASTHMA AND CANINE BRONCHITIS TREATMENT PATH & DOSING GUIDELINES

1 Treat Exacerbation!	2 Gain Airway Control	3 Transition to Inhalers	4 Daily Management																																				
<p><b>Ensure animal can breathe</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Immediate dilation of airways to provide respiratory relief</li> <li>• Provide injectable steroid and either inhaled or injectable bronchodilator</li> <li>• Injections administered in clinic/hospital</li> <li>• Inhaled bronchodilator may be administered in clinic or at home by owner</li> </ul>	<p><b>Clear the airways</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Reduce airway inflammation and regain control of airways</li> <li>• Provide short term course of systemic steroids</li> <li>• 10-day therapy course</li> </ul>	<p><b>Introduce Inhaled Therapy</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Taper systemic steroids while introducing inhaled steroids</li> <li>• Overlap therapy for 2 weeks</li> <li>• Inhaled steroids effectively target the airways for disease control without the side effects of systemic steroids</li> </ul>	<p><b>Maintain disease control</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Maintenance therapy to keep inflammation controlled and prevent exacerbations</li> <li>• Daily therapy for symptom management</li> <li>• Cat owners can administer inhaled bronchodilator during flare ups from exposure to triggers</li> </ul>																																				
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
